Free for download in Win32/64bit (this version works only in the 32 bit mode for aA way of keeping the Israeli people safe from the consequences of their government's actions is being offered by a Palestinian engineering professor at the German University of Tel Aviv. The professor, who wishes to remain anonymous, has come up with a means of bomb disposal that, he claims, will make Israel less likely to respond to future Hamas missile attacks with their own. He told the Daily Telegraph that: "We are not talking about Israeli civilians being bombed here, it's about the consequences for the Israeli military. "We are trying to create a system of defense that will eliminate the ability of the Israel military to retaliate for a Hamas missile attack with a retaliatory attack." The professor is reported to have already introduced the idea of using a low-explosive design in a recent conference held in Tel Aviv

that was attended by over 100 military and civilian experts. The work has sparked a heated debate within the Israeli military and has even led to the resignation of some senior officers who do not support the proposal. Although the professor is very likely to face a backlash when he makes the idea public, he insists the system will be affordable for the Israeli Defence Force. The Israeli military is believed to be spending around \$2.2 billion a year on missile defense, which is expected to rise to over \$3.1 billion this year. While Israel has developed various counter-missile systems and anti-aircraft defence systems, the Israelis have only made use of the former, so far. The professor's idea of designing a system to "shield" Israel from retaliation would, according to reports, be the only practical use of their anti-aircraft systems in the future. A senior Israeli army officer is quoted in the Telegraph as saying that the time has now come to discuss the issue in public: "The time has come to bring this to the table. If it is a credible proposal we should not hesitate to pursue it." The professor was cited as saying: "I think it is time to think of a technological solution that could actually save lives."Q: 2d92ce491b
